- 4. Land Acknowledgment Aileen S. (Principal)

The CBE Land Acknowledgement has been renewed with approval by the Elder Advisory Council in Oct 2024. It takes a level of thoughtfulness and vulnerability to share one's personal reflection on land acknowledgement. Travelling during her deferred-salary leave gave Aileen the opportunity to really pay attention to the land around her. She paid special attention to Indigenous art and voices in the lands that she travelled to. She also had meaningful conversations with her family about where her family came from, and their connections to the lands they moved to. In the past and present, in many lands, the relationships between Indigenous people and settlers are complicated and important as we steward the land together. Henry Wise Wood is committed to ReconciliACTION. The school creates spaces for all of our voices, creating a cultural mosaic. We focus on Body-To Do-

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community events and connections, as well as Mind-To Know- task designing interweaving Indigenous Ways of Knowing. In Warrior Connect, students are beginning to write their own land acknowledgements.
